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Overview

This publication is reports on the results of an international survey on nuclear disarmament issues conducted as part of my research project “Theoretical Analyses of the Essence and Conditions for the Promotion of Nuclear Disarmament: Effects and Potentials of IAEA Inspections,” supported by The Japan Society for the Promotion of Science Kakenhi (Grants-in-Aid for Scientific Research) (No.20K01517, Principal investigator: Kiyohisa Shibai, Fiscal Year 2020-2024).

The objectives of this research are to examine the effectiveness of IAEA (International Atomic Energy Agency) inspections on disarmament policies and identify points for improvement. The academic significance of this study consists in tis verification of the improvement of the inspection system by examining the specific implementation process of IAEA inspections, which have been criticized for their opacity. This study has explored how to make the inspection system more effective by obtaining information not included in previous studies, and on this basis, examined inspection methods to improve the ability to detect violations and the effectiveness of deterring violations.

This is specially intended to contribute to the denuclearization of Northeast Asia and to prevent the emergence and existence of new nuclear powers. It focuses on the role of IAEA inspections, and an international survey was also conducted to examine the possibility of promoting the cause of nuclear disarmament among the general public.

Of course, many people tend to favor nuclear disarmament in general, but it is not clear whether there is a correlation between general trends in opinion and nuclear-related policies. Even in the only country to have ever suffered atomic bombings, Japan, whose policy has oscillated between nuclear disarmament and reliance on U.S. nuclear deterrence, it is unclear whether simple acquiescence is robust enough to translate into an actual policy of denuclearization. To verify this question, this study is conducted with a particular emphasis on clarifying the real intentions of the respondents, with an awareness of the real issues linked to people’s lives, such as security issues (nuclear umbrella) and energy issues (nuclear power plants). This report is a compilation of the results of surveys conducted in South Korea and Australia in 2023, following the Japanese and U.S. surveys in 2022.

South Korea is a potential nuclear power, that is, a state that has an incentive for nuclear possession and the technologies to develop nuclear weapons. It is difficult to anticipate South Korean evaluations on nuclear issues because South Korea has serious security issues due to nuclearization by North Korea. South Korea presently depends on the US nuclear umbrella. However, it had developed nuclear weapons and reached the point just before their completion during the 1970s. Analyses of the public opinion in a country under nuclear threat will provide important insights on nuclear disarmament issues.

Australia is an example of a non-nuclear power, that is, a country under no nuclear threat. Australia is an appropriate choice for comparison with Japan, U.S., and South Korea because Australia is relatively close to Northeast Asia and is located in a safe region with few conflicts. Australia is also affected by nuclear issues because it is a major uranium exporter. As the Australian economy can be affected if the demand for uranium decreases, the survey can also clarify the effect of economic interest on opinions regarding nuclear issues.

Taiwan was selected for investigation as a potential nuclear power because of its history of secretly pursuing a nuclear weapons development program during the Cold War, which was blocked by the U.S., and its long-standing experience under strong military pressure from China. In recent years, this pressure has intensified as the Beijing government has repeatedly conducted military exercises in the Taiwan Strait, prompting the Taiwanese

government to extend the conscription period from four months to one year. This heightened tension is a key reason why this survey was deemed urgent.

Vietnam, which has been engaged in an ongoing territorial dispute with China over the Spratly Islands since the 1970s, was also selected for the survey of potential nuclear powers in East Asia. Prior to this period, Vietnam experienced decades of conflict with major powers, including an anti-colonial struggle against France, the Japanese occupation, the Indochina War, and the war with the United States. Examining the unique Vietnamese perspective on national security and their values regarding nuclear deterrence is particularly significant.

Comparative analyses of potentially diverse perspectives from a country subjected to atomic bombings, a nuclear power, a potential nuclear power, and a non-nuclear power are now possible owing to the data from the surveys conducted during 2022–2023 (See Shibai 2022 for the research plan). Additionally, survey data on Taiwan and Vietnam—nations with significant conflicts in East Asia, including territorial disputes with nuclear powers—were collected. This data enables a comparative analysis of the security environment and public opinion across the East Asian region, alongside data on Japan and South Korea. It is hoped that this research will contribute to the promotion of nuclear disarmament and bring us closer to the nuclear abolition strongly desired by the Japanese people, particularly those in Hiroshima and Nagasaki.

The content of this report is the result of research conducted by the authors and collaborating researchers (mainly funded by Grants-in-Aid for Scientific Research and internal expenses), and the design of the survey items and their interpretation are the responsibility of the authors. The content of this report, including interpretations and evaluations, expresses the author's personal views and does not represent the views of their organizations.

1 Academic Background of the Survey and Composition of Survey Items

1.1 Academic Background

The context to this study is the deteriorating international situation regarding nuclear disarmament. From around 1989, when the Cold War ended, to the early 2000s, the number of nuclear weapons possessed mainly by the United States, United Kingdom, Russia, and France declined, but from the end of the 2000s, the number of nuclear weapons these countries possessed remained almost flat, while the nuclear arsenals of China, India, and Pakistan increased. It publicly acknowledged its possession of nuclear weapons by amending its constitution to declare itself a nuclear power in 2012, and North Korea has repeatedly conducted nuclear tests and ballistic missile tests since 2013. In October 2020, more than 50 countries ratified the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons (TPNW), which bans various actions that could lead to the possession of nuclear weapons, and the treaty entered into force in January 2021. However, not a few states, including the nuclear weapon states and Japan, have questioned the significance of the treaty, and it remains uncertain whether it will advance nuclear disarmament.

Furthermore, in the case of the Russian invasion of Ukraine in 2022, Russian President Vladimir Putin, struggling to resolve the situation, threatened to use nuclear weapons to prevent other countries from intervening as Russia's war effort struggled. This clearly demonstrated the willingness of the major powers to consider nuclear weapons use as an option even in the post-Cold War world. It is symbolic event of indicating the stagnation or retreat of international nuclear disarmament policy that Russia suggested the first use of nuclear weapons, even though the Soviet Union declared in 1982 that it would not be the first to use nuclear weapons.

Since Brennan (1961), Bull (1961, 1965), and Schelling and Halperin (1961) laid the foundation for the study of nuclear disarmament and arms control, it has been clearly stated that the goal of nuclear disarmament, arms control, and even nuclear abolition is to prevent or decrease the possibility of nuclear war. Nuclear deterrence is a means to an end. Since nuclear deterrence is closely related to the argument for achieving this objective, and since disarmament and arms control policies that destabilize nuclear deterrence risk increasing the likelihood of nuclear war (Glaser 1998), simply reducing nuclear weapons or limiting nuclear technology can not achieve this objective. Therefore, nuclear disarmament policies, including nuclear deterrence, must always take into account their impact on the possibility of nuclear war.

The no first use of nuclear weapons is intended to decrease the likelihood of nuclear war. It had also contributed to the reduction of mutual distrust by showing that there was no intention to attack. Since the invasion of Ukraine, Russia has shown a willingness to abandon this security policy, which has increased the possibility of nuclear war.

Consequently, the nuclear policy environment is deteriorating, and to overcome the current situation, it will be necessary to promote nuclear disarmament, not only through conventional means but also through a variety of other methods.

1.2 Composition of Survey Items

Based on this awareness of the above issues, the survey questions were designed to elicit as much as possible the respondents' genuine attitudes toward nuclear questions, which are complex and difficult to express, including

not only their values where nuclear issues in general were concerned, but also values that indicated an awareness of nuclear deterrence and values regarding real security issues (芝井 2022). To develop the questions, Deutsch (1967), ICRC (2019), Press, Sagan, and Valentino (2013), and Sagan and Valentino (2017) were referred to, as were surveys by the American research firms Gallup and Pew Research Center.

Since international political surveys may be difficult or impossible to conduct depending on a country's political system and laws, this study attempts to select countries and regions that are both necessary and feasible to survey. The data will be used to fill in the gaps, and the survey data will be examined in terms of the security effects of nuclear deterrence on different countries, the military power of adversary states, the fear of being involved in nuclear war, the peaceful use of nuclear weapons, and the influence of humanitarian ethics and norms and their interactions, to explore their impact on values, and ultimately the mechanisms that can strengthen opinions on nuclear disarmament.

Table 1 Four Classifications of States according to the Nuclear Issue

Country to have ever suffered atomic bombings	Nation that has experienced a nuclear attack: Japan.
Nuclear power	States with nuclear weapons: U.S., U.K., France, Russia, China, India, Pakistan, Israel, and North Korea.
Potential nuclear power	Non-nuclear weapon states that face a strong military threat, especially nuclear threat, and have an incentive to possess nuclear weapons: South Korea, Taiwan, Iran, etc.
Non-nuclear power	States that have no incentive to possess nuclear weapons: Australia, Canada, etc.

This study also examines whether the effects of these independent variables depend on the status of the state. It is highly likely attitudes toward nuclear weapons depends on the status of a state: whether it is a state with the world's leading military and technological capabilities, or a state that is under pressure from a nuclear power and depends on the nuclear umbrella.

Therefore, in analyzing international public opinion, I categorized states into the four groups (Table 1), and selected states from each group from which to obtain data (芝井 2022b). In addition, I will conduct a comparative inter-group and international analysis of the formation of global public opinion. I had completed surveys in Japan, Hiroshima, Nagasaki, and U.S. in 2022. However, comparative analyses among the four types of countries was possible only after the completion of the South Korean and Australian surveys in 2023 (Shibai 2022; 芝井 2022a).

The survey items are designed to obtain responses to a variety of questions related to nuclear weapons, specifically, evaluation of nuclear disarmament, evaluation of nuclear abolition, evaluation of nuclear deterrence, justification of nuclear attack, anxiety about military conflict, security issues in Northeast Asia, IAEA inspections, and nuclear power plants, on an ordinal scale of 4 to 6, to be used for statistical analysis. The complex correlations and interactions among items will be thereby revealed, as will the nature of the relationship that between nuclear deterrence and nuclear disarmament.

The peaceful uses of nuclear technology are measured separately because they are the most relevant to the daily reality of nuclear-related issues, and there is enough information available to extract them as a separate component. In addition, their existence, which involves the dichotomy of usefulness directly related to daily life and the danger

of mass loss of life, is an item expected to have an impact on attitudes toward nuclear weapons. The questions about IAEA are similarly based on the contradiction between the right of states to the peaceful use of nuclear energy as expressed in President Eisenhower's "Atoms for Peace" speech and the danger of nuclear proliferation and the inherent contradictions in nuclear technology. The overall purpose of the study is to measure which people value more: the rights of states or the stability of the international community. The survey items belonging to each category were set up to extract the main components of nuclear deterrence, nuclear disarmament, and peaceful uses of nuclear weapons, so to speak, as part of the overall structure, and the following questions were asked: How do the four groups of states differ with respect to relationships among the individual survey items, what kind of correlation exists among the items, and what variables strongly contribute to pro-nuclear disarmament value? Verification of these results would be a significant achievement for nuclear disarmament research.

A comparative analysis of the four groups of citizens from the 2022 and 2023 surveys revealed a low level of trust in nuclear deterrence and a high level of trust in nuclear disarmament among Japanese citizens, particularly those from Hiroshima and Nagasaki, in comparison to other groups. Their views on nuclear deterrence and disarmament, along with the correlations among factors related to these topics, often varied progressively across the categories of countries: from those that have suffered atomic bombings, to nuclear powers, potential nuclear powers, and finally non-nuclear powers, with trust in nuclear deterrence generally increasing in the latter groups (Shibai 2024b).

These findings reaffirmed the importance of collecting further survey data to identify ways to promote nuclear disarmament and to enable more precise comparative analyses. This recognition led to the inclusion of Taiwan and Vietnam in the surveys. In response to the deteriorating security environment in East Asia, several questions were added or modified to strengthen the section on regional security issues (see Ch.4, "Modification History").

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2 Research Method

2.1 Outline of Survey Methods

This survey was conducted under ethical review by the Institute of Statistical Mathematics (approval number: ISM24-01).

In order to include people who experienced the atomic bombing of Japan in the survey, voters aged 80 and older were also included. However, due to difficulties in recruiting a sample of older voters, especially those in their 80s and above, as planned, they were allocated to other age groups. The deviations in the sampling numbers due to the rounding of decimal points in the calculating the allocations were adjusted accordingly.

【subject of the survey】

1. Population

3. Sampling Method

Quota samples were drawn from the opt-in panels of the commissioned survey company (Japan, Hiroshima and Nagasaki survey), or affiliated opt-in panels of the survey company (The U.S.).

Sample members were solicited to participate in the survey to ensure that the quota set for each gender × age × region cell was sufficient, and if the initial quota was exceeded, a number of final respondents equal to the allocated size were randomly selected from the initial respondents.

【Survey Method】

Web survey.

The Web survey implementation and Web screen creation were outsourced to the research firm ASMARQ, Inc. Taiwan and Vietnam surveys were conducted by a panel of ASMARQ's partners. The registration and participation in the survey were voluntary acts of the opt-in panels themselves.

【Questionnaire】 (See "Appendix.")

1. Questionnaires

Taiwan	49 items (Multiple-choice response items and free response items)
Vietnam	49 items (Multiple-choice response items and free response items)

The Japanese version of the questionnaire was prepared and then translated into English and Korean.

2. Content of Survey Items

The survey items are classified into eight categories.

1. Attribute information
2. On nuclear disarmament (general opinion on nuclear disarmament, opinion under specific conditions, etc.)
3. On nuclear weapons (opinions on the effectiveness of nuclear deterrence, justification for possessing nuclear weapons, justification for nuclear attack, etc.)
4. On nuclear abolition and nuclear energy (agreement with nuclear abolition, opinion that nuclear abolition is possible, opinion on nuclear energy abolition, opinion that nuclear energy abolition is feasible, etc.)
5. Regional security issues (serious conflicts on the Korean Peninsula, serious conflicts in the South China Sea, etc.)
6. The IAEA (contributions of the IAEA, strengthening of the IAEA's authority, etc.)
7. Democracy and government (evaluation of democracy, important elements in democracy, etc.)
8. Nuclear weapons-related education (e.g., nuclear education you have received)

【Research Period】

Taiwan: From September 10, 2024, to September 19, 2024.

Vietnam: From September 10, 2024, to September 20, 2024.

2.2 Sample Size and Quota

The surveys were targeted toward people aged 18 years and over. However, people older than 60 years were allocated to a single group because the partner companies indicated that it would be difficult to survey older age groups in Taiwan and Vietnam. In Taiwan and Vietnam, the shortfall had to be allocated to other age groups and regions because the number of online panels with people in the older age group was small, and data collection was difficult.

The Eastern and Kinma regions (金馬地区), which have the smallest population in Taiwan, were merged with the Central region to create a more balanced comparison with the population of the Southern region. This approach specifically aimed to collect at least a small sample from the Kinma region, which, despite its very small population, includes Kinmen (Quemoy) Island—a critical frontline location adjacent to mainland China.

2.3 Regional Distribution of Samples
